
What is my child not getting?

- As many lessons delivered by the teacher because the teacher has to spend time conducting assessments, reporting data and attending meetings. Lessons are instead, delivered by paras, student interns, or substitute teachers.
- As many lessons that encourage creativity and deep understanding. State and district mandated lessons are rigid and contain much more busy work.

What is my child's teacher not getting?

- TIME to observe students and support their social emotional development
- TIME to plan with colleagues to address the needs of our students population (20% students on IEP, 10% non-English speakers)
- TIME to reflect on students learning and meet with parents
- TIME to create engaging learning experiences for their students
- TIME to plan outside of school experiences for students (field trips, etc.
- . **TIME** to collaborate for cross-grade partnerships
- . **TIME** to plan before and after school celebration (Morning Share, Poetry Night, etc.)
